



BAY OF FUNDY SCARF

This scarf is pure luxury to wear - 2 skeins of the softest wool imaginable draped stylishly over your shoulders or wrapped up snug around your neck.

It's called the Bay of Fundy scarf because it was inspired by the tides at the Bay, and because I knitted most of it while on vacation :) It's a great travel knit because of the lightweight yarn, and mostly mindless nature of the pattern. The cabling is not complicated but produces a very dense fabric, so if you choose to change yarns make sure to use a needle that is one size larger than your yarn requires.



Yarn: 2 skeins of Tanis Fiber Arts Purple Label Cashmere.

Needles: 3.5 mm straights, cable needle.

Extras: 2 stitch markers, tapestry needle

Finished dimensions: 12" wide x 72" long

Cast on 88 stitches

You will work a seed stitch border as follows:

Row 1: k1 p1 to end

Row 2: p1 k1 to end

Repeat rows 1 and 2 once more.

Knit across for one row as follows: p16, place marker, p20, place marker, purl to end.

Begin the cable pattern (worked over 8 rows):

Row 1: k12, p2, k10, p2, k10, p2, k10, p4, k20, p4, k12

Row 2 (and all wrong side rows): Keep the first 2 stitches and the last 2 stitches in garter stitch for the border, otherwise work all stitches as they appear: k2, p10, k4, p20, k4, p10, k2, p10, k2, p10, k2, p10, k2

Row 3: k12, p2, k10, p2, k10, p2, k10, p4, slip marker, k4, *cable 3 back (slip 3 stitches onto cable needle and hold to the back, k3 then k3 from cable needle)* Repeat from * once more k4, slip marker, p4, k12

Row 5: k12, p2, k10, p2, k10, p2, k10, p4, k20, p4, k12

Row 7: k12, p2, k10, p2, k10, p2, k10, p4, slip marker,

k1, *cable 3 front (slip 3 stitches onto cable needle and hold to the front, k3 then k3 from cable needle)* Repeat from * twice more k1, slip marker, p4, k12

Work one more wrong side row

Work these 8 rows until it's the length you want, or until you have just enough yardage left over for the border, ending on a row 7.

Next row (facing the wrong side): knit your way across, removing the markers as you go.

Work in seed stitch as follows:

Row 1: k1 p1 to end

Row 2: p1 k1 to end

Repeat rows 1 and 2 once more.

Bind off loosely, wash and lay flat to dry.
